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## DEVELOP STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

Start with why you need technology in the first place. This step gives clarity on what you need technology to do, not just what it is.

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## ENGAGE YOUR STAKEHOLDERS

Involve stakeholders in planning sessions. This step saves time and makes transitions smoother and easier to adopt.

- Host discovery sessions
- Collect feedback regularly
- Communicate often
- Assign ownership when needed

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## ASSESS YOUR CAPABILITIES

Take stock of what you already have and how well it's working. This honest assessment becomes the foundation for informed decisions.

- Inventory your tech stack
- Evaluate performance across different silos
- Check integrations
- Audit risk

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## IDENTIFY GAPS & OPPORTUNITIES

Look for what's missing and what could be better. This step reveals where to invest and what to fix first.

- Analyze security shortfalls
- Find inefficient tools and processes
- Identify growth blockers
- Determine areas for needed improvement

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## PRIORITIZE RECOMMENDATIONS

Determine which solutions deliver the most value.

- Complete high-value, low-effort projects
- Prioritize projects that reduce exposure to threats
- Address projects with urgent regulatory requirements

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## DEVELOP YOUR TIMELINE

Put dates, milestones, and team leaders in place. A realistic timeline keeps the plan alive instead of letting it gather dust.

- Assign dates and team leaders
- Break goals into milestones
- Complete critical projects first
- Check progress regularly
